**DIVISION OF PLAY:** 

Boys Division: Grade level: 4th grade/10 and under, 5th grade/11 and under, 6th grade/12

and under, 7<sup>th</sup> grade/13 and under, 8<sup>th</sup> grade/14 and under.

Girls Division: Grade level: 10 and under, 11 and under.

FEE: \$150.00 plus \$10.00 per player for AAU membership card

\$12.00 fee for head coach for AAU membership card

Player or Coaches card must be paid for before it will be issued. Participants must have card to be covered by

insurance.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Completed registration form and money must be turned in by Wednesday February 14<sup>th</sup> 2001 by 7:00 p.m. (as availability permits)

**COACHES MEETING:** Thursday February 22, 2001 at 7:00 p.m. at the Nampa Senior Center.

GAMES: All teams will play at least three (3) games. Depending on the number of teams, some of the games could be played Sunday February 25th, 2001.







GAME TIMES: TBA

AWARDS: A. Team trophies to the top three teams in each age division.

- B. Individual medals for members of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place teams in each age division.
- C. Participant certificates to all players that participate.

AGE DETERMINATION: Boys - September 1, 2001 and Girls - January 1, 2001 shall be determining dates for the age of the competitor and shall also hold true for the Association and National Tournaments. Exception: Junior rule in the 17 and under age division.

**ROSTER:** The roster established at the time of the first game must be used throughout the entire tournament. No additions or changes are permitted. All players must have AAU cards purchased to play. Any player who has ever attended college or junior college is not eligible to compete in the AAU Boys Basketball Program. Boys National AAU rules limit the roster to 15 players. Girls National AAU rules limit the roster to 15 players. (Note pick-up player rule for advancement).

#### RULES:

All divisions will play National High School Federation Rules with the following exceptions:

A. Special technical foul rule - any foul will constitute an automatic penalty of two points and the ball will be placed out of bounds.

- B. Divisions 12/under will use a 28 ½ inch women's ball.
- C. Playing time:

- D. Two technical fouls on a coach constitutes an ejection from the game.
- E. Two technical fouls on a player means the player is benched.
- F. No pressing (full or half court) after your team is ahead by 20 or more points (includes half court trap).

**SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:** All teams must provide their own numbered jerseys, towels, and basketballs.

WE HOPE WE ALL ARE TEACHING OUR YOUTH GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP. WHAT YOU PRESENT ON THE BENCH, THE YOUTH WILL FOLLOW.

Also, please talk to your parents about their conduct at the game. If a parent or coach goes on the floor to confront an official or scorekeeper in an unsportsmanlike manor, the team could forfeit the remainder of its games. The team will not be allowed to

play in another tournament.

POOR SPORTSMANSHIP IS NOT TOLERATED IN THIS TOURNAMENT.

#### AAU BASKETBALL - ELIGIBILITY

- 1. All participants must be AAU members. Contact your local AAU Association Office for membership information. Player cards are \$10.00 for one year, and Coaches cards are \$12.00 for one year. AAU membership may be applied to any of the 16 sports in the Youth Sports Program.
- 2. All basketball clubs must be members of the local AAU Association. Club/team membership is \$20.00 for one year.
- 3. **Girls** <u>January 1, 2001</u> and **Boys** <u>September 1, 2001</u> shall be the determining dates for the age of the competitor and shall hold true for the Association and National Championships.
  - **Boys Division**: Junior Rule in the 17 and under age division: Any player who is a High School Junior as of the current academic year and who was born on or after September 1, 1983 may participate in the Junior division.
- 4. A player may participate in ONLY ONE AGE DIVISION of the AAU Basketball Program for which they can qualify. **Exception**: A player participating in the 16 and Under Division may also compete in <u>either</u> the Junior Boys' Division <u>or</u> the Senior Boys' Division.
- 5. Any player who has ever attended college or junior college is not eligible to compete in the AAU Basketball Program.
- 6. Residency requirements are to be governed by the AAU Code.
- 7. A player becomes a member of an AAU Basketball club/team when they participate in a nationally approved AAU Basketball event or a national qualifying event.
- 8. A three (3) person eligibility committee will be established to rule on player and team eligibility. Their decision will be final. This committee will be appointed by the AAU Basketball Chairman.
- 9. If a player is found to be ineligible prior to the start of the tournament, the player will be expelled from the tournament. If a player is found to be ineligible after the tournament has started, not only will the player be expelled, but the team will also be expelled from the tournament. Coaches are responsible to see that their teams meet all eligibility requirements. Illegal Player Penalty: Automatic Expulsion from AAU for 1 year.
- 10. Boys Procedure for Advancing to National Championship:

Gold: 3-5 teams; One team only may advance. Silver: 6-8 teams; Two teams may advance. Bronze: 9-24 teams; Three teams may advance. 4<sup>th</sup> Place: 25-47 teams; Four teams may advance. 5<sup>th</sup> Place: 48 or more teams; Five teams may advance.

**Exceptions:** In the 9:U/3<sup>rd</sup> grade, 10:Under/4<sup>th</sup> grade and Sr. Boys' Division ONLY, the fourth place team may advance if 16 or more teams participate in the association qualifying tournament.

<sup>\*</sup>Participation is defined as a registered team that has actually played in its Association age group qualifier. A registered team that forfeits all its games shall not be counted as a participating team.

### **Boys:**

#### A. Age Determining Date for advancement to National Championships:

September 1, 2001 shall be the determining date for the age of the competitor for all Association and National Championships as follows:

- 4<sup>th</sup> Grade/10 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1990. Exception: A player who is in the 4<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1989 can participate in the 10-under/4<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade/11 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1989. Exception: A player who is in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1988 can participate in the 11-under/5<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Grade/12 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1988. Exception: A player who is in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1987 can participate in the 12-under/6<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 7<sup>th</sup> Grade/13 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1987. Exception: A player who is in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1986 can participate in the 13-under/7<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade/14 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1986. Exception: A player who is in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1985 can participate in the 14-under/8<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 9<sup>th</sup> Grade/15 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1985. Exception: A player who is in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1984 can participate in the 15-under/9<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- 10<sup>th</sup> Grade/16 and Under: Born on or after September 1, 1984. Exception: A player who is in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade and who was born on or after September 1, 1983 can participate in the 16-under/10<sup>th</sup> Grade Division.
- Juniors: Born on or after September 1, 1983. Exception: A player who is a Junior and who was born on or after September 1, 1982 can participate in the Junior Division.
- Seniors: Born on or after September 1, 1981 and can't participate beyond the summer of his High School Graduation.
- **B.** Grade Confirmation: Players participating under the grade eligibility exception must present a birth certificate and confirmation of grade level from the School Administrator. NOTE: Grade level is determined by players grade on March 1, 2001.
- C. Player Participation: A player may participate In Only One Age Division of the AAU Boys' Basketball Program for which he/she can qualify.
  - a. A player participating in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade /15-U division may also compete in either the 10<sup>th</sup> grade /16-U, Junior of Senior Divisions. (Maximum of two age divisions.)
  - b. A player participating in the 10<sup>th</sup> grade/16-U division may also compete in either the Junior or the Senior Division.
  - c. A player in the Junior Boys' Division may also compete in the Senior Boys' Division.

d. Players who compete in more than one division under this Rule must compete with the same AAU club.
