AAU Membership Fees: Player \$14 / Coach \$16

All players and coaches must have an AAU Card. If it is found that a player is participating without a current AAU card, your team will be subject to forfeits of games with no refund of tournament fees paid. **REMEMBER: Membership cards don't get you into the game for free. Only players that are playing are allowed into the game free.**

The Lystedt Law

Washington State has passed a law requiring youth coaches, athletes and parents/guardians complete certain criteria regarding the recognition and treatment of head injuries during sporting events. ALL PARTICIPATING TEAMS must complete the attached form and return it to the Inland Empire AAU office with the tournament entry form. We only need 1 form per team per year!

Tournament Rules:

- 1. A player may play for only **ONE** team during tournament play.
- 2. Players cannot wear jewelry of any kind during games, even if it is taped and/or covered up.
- 3. Players must be enrolled in 3rd grade or older.
- 4. Players cannot switch teams once games have started.
- 5. We reserve the right to refuse a team's entry into our events.
- 6. Scorekeepers each team is to have ONE person to keep the individual score sheet that is provided in your coaches' packet. One scorekeeper per team will be allowed into the game free of charge. Please leave scoresheets with the gym supervisor after your game.
- 7. Coaches Only ONE coach per team is allowed into the game free, but more than one may coach & must have a current AAU card.
- 8. Admission The gyms are run Saturday: Adults \$5, Students/Seniors \$3. Sunday: Adults \$5 Students/Seniors \$3. PLEASE INFORM YOUR PARENTS!
- Ball Size: Grades Boys 3 and Girls 3-4 27.5"; Boys 4-6 and Girls 5-8 28.5"; Boys 7-8 29.5"
- 10. The Home team is listed last on the tournament schedule with its bench to the left of the scorer's table when looking from center court. Each team will warm up opposite their bench to start the game.
- 11. Whenever possible (both referees are present and coaches agree), games may start up to five minutes early following the minimum five (5) minute warm-up period.

Rules of play:

2019-2020 High School Rules will be played, with the following exceptions.

- 1. No shot clock.
- 2. Seven (7) minute quarters for all grade levels. Two (2) minutes between quarters. Five (5) min half-time.
- 3. 5 min warm-up between games.
- Overtime 2 minutes.
- 5. Press Rule: 15 points. No full court press once your team is up by more than 15 points. Enforcement of the "press" rule will be a warning for the first infraction. The second infraction will be a technical foul and the opposing team will be awarded two points and the ball out of bounds.
- 6. Technical or Intentional fouls- 2 points awarded and ball out of bounds. Technical fouls to not count as a personal foul on the player or a team foul. One technical foul on a coach and they are restricted to the bench for the remainder of the game. One technical on a player, the player sits on the bench for the remainder of the game. Officials and Gym Administrators have the right to eject fan, player or coach. Coaches and fans must leave the entire gym.
- 7. Two technical fouls in the tournament on a player or a coach, they are removed completely from the tournament. ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS!
- 8. Forfeit time Game time. You must have 5 players to start the game.

CONCUSSION LAW AND SUDDEN CARDIAC ARREST REQUIREMENTS

HB1824, otherwise known as the Zachery Lystedt Law, was signed into law on May 14, 2009. It requires, as of July 26, 2009, that additional steps be taken regarding concussions in private non-profit youth athletic programs using school district facilities. Sudden Cardiac Arrest SB 5083 sec 3 became law on July 15, 2015 which also requires educational training.

This bills requires training and documentation which AAU Member Clubs must adhere to. AAU players and their parents/guardians must meet these minimum requirements: Go to www.ieaau.org upper right hand side of the web site Lystedt Law information:

- 1. All AAU member coaches will have to take training on the nature and risk of concussions and head injury including continuing to play after a concussion or head injury and the Sudden Cardiac Arrest information provided.
- 2. On a yearly basis, a concussion and head injury/Sudden Cardiac Arrest information sheet shall be signed and returned by the youth athlete and athlete's parents/guardian prior to the youth athlete's initiating practice or competition.
- 3. All athletes suspected of suffering a concussion or brain injury will be removed from practice or competition and not returned to play until cleared in writing by a licensed health care provider trained in the evaluation and management of concussions (Medical Doctors, Doctor of Osteopathy, Advanced Registered Nurse Practitioner, Physicians Assistants, and *Certified* Athletic Trainers).
- 4. This is a requirement to use any public facility. As a team participating in any AAU Club event, this must be signed And return to the Event Operator
